This is an opportunity to tell your Tribal story and offer feedback on Tribal CCDF topics that are important to your communities.

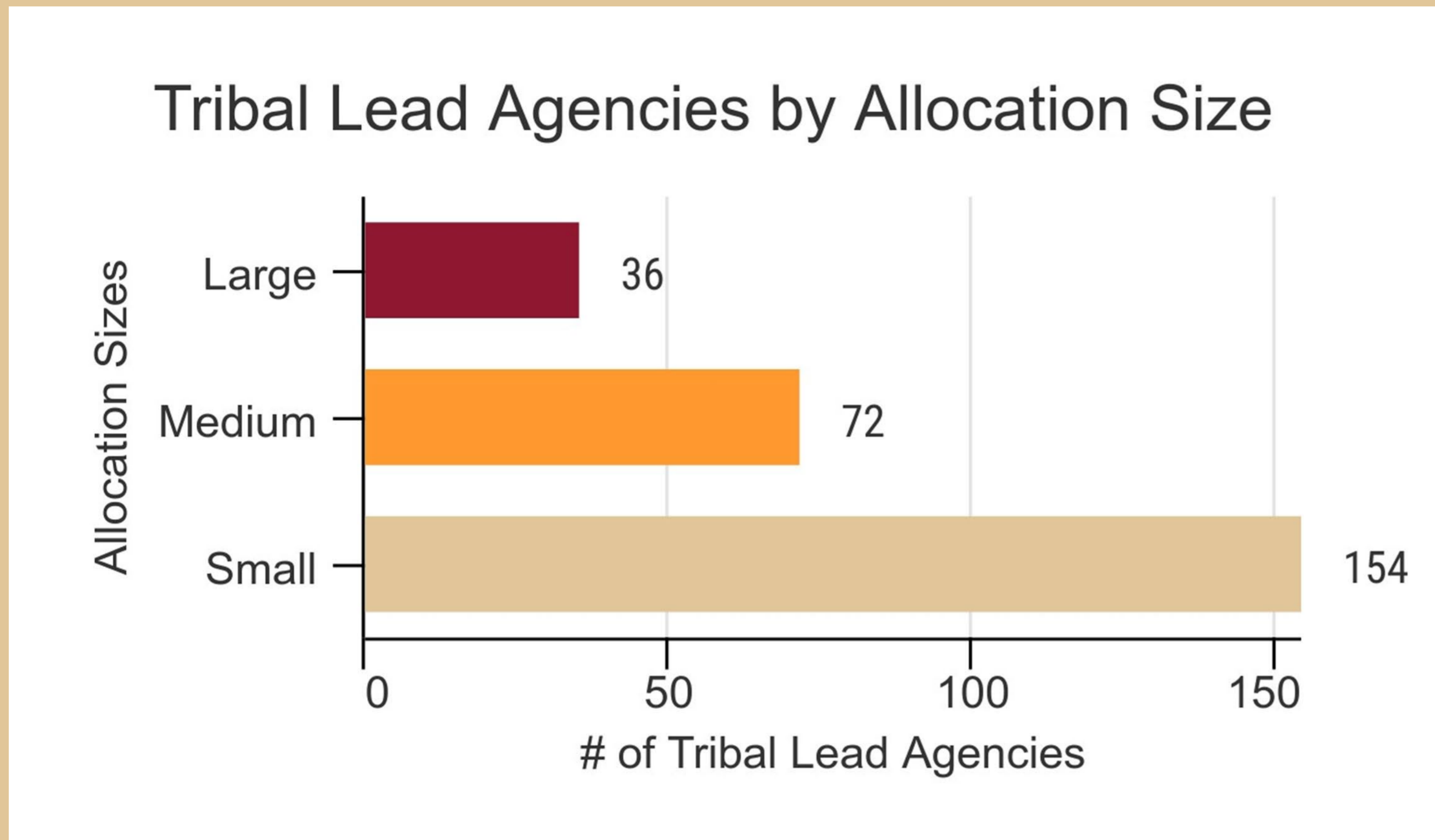

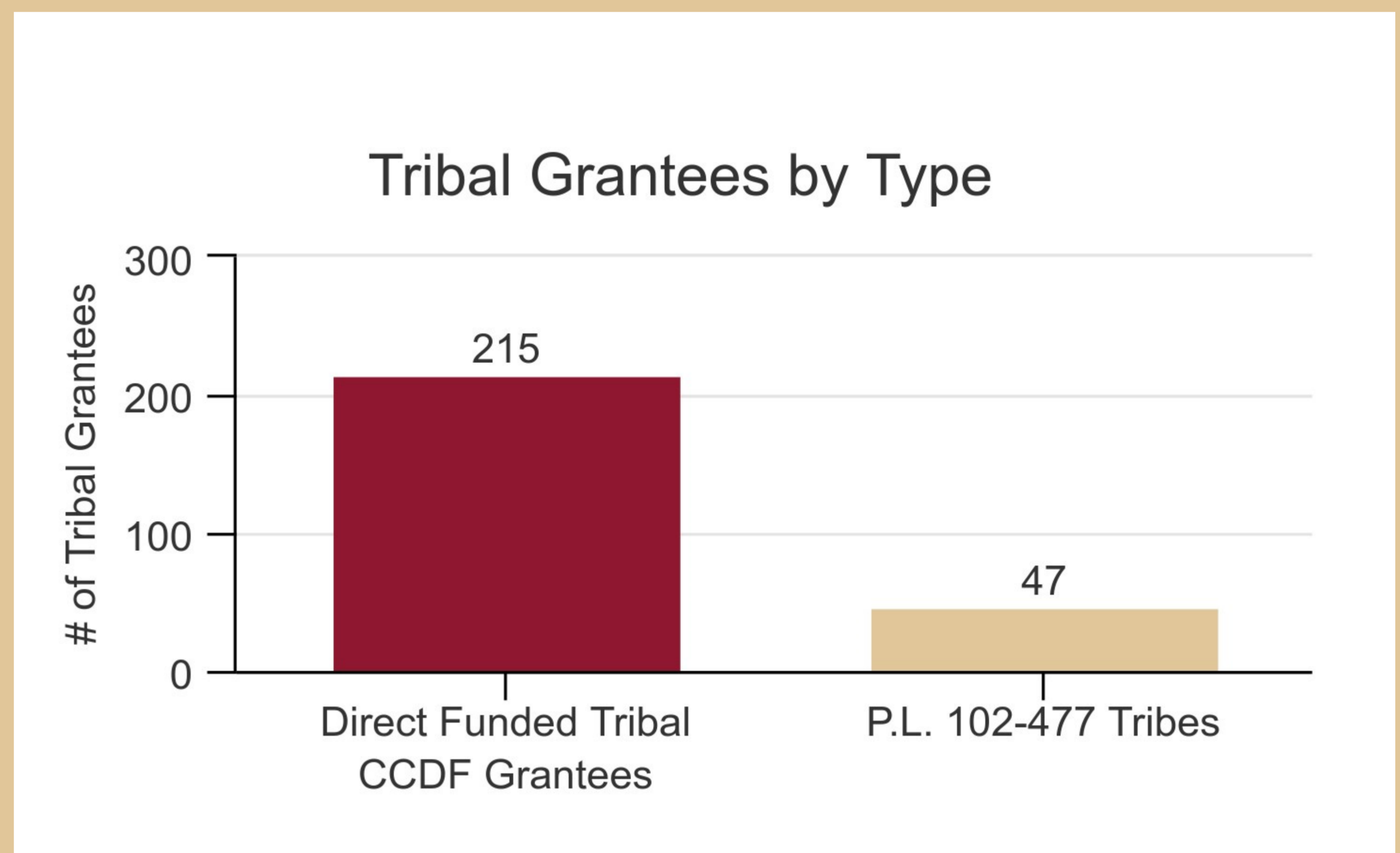
Tribal Lead Agencies by Allocation Size



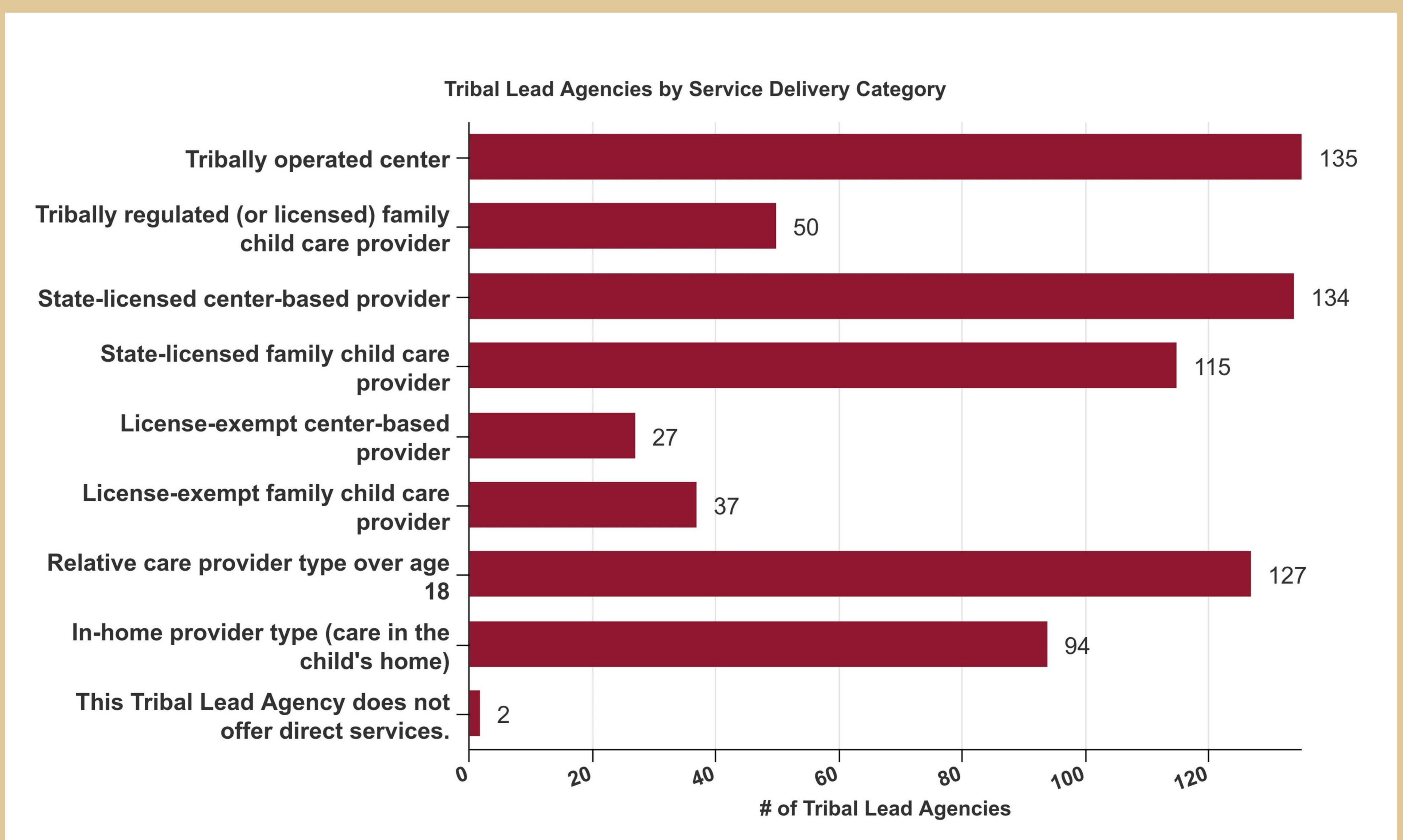

Variations in Tribal CCDF Funding

OCC refers to Tribal Lead Agencies that receive their funding directly from ACF as "direct-funded" Tribal Lead Agencies.
