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

What is the Tribal CCDF Plan?



- The Tribal Lead Agency's application for CCDF funds:
 - Describes the Tribal Lead Agency's child care program and services available to eligible families
 - Contains specific assurances and certifications required by CCDBG Act of 2014 and accompanying rule
 - Provides information about the overall management of CCDF services



FY 2020-2022 Tribal CCDF Plan

- This is the first Tribal CCDF Plan submitted according to both CCDBG Act of 2014 and CCDF Final Rule
- Historic increases in CCDF funds to Tribal Lead Agencies in the last two fiscal years
 - Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2018 included an overall increase in CCDF
 Discretionary funds from \$137 million in FY 2017 to \$359 million in FY 2018 and \$360
 million in FY2019
 - This includes a 2.75% set-aside from discretionary funds and a 2% set-aside from mandatory funds
 - The FY 2018 and FY 2019 appropriation laws also allocated an additional \$157 million specifically for Tribal Lead Agencies
- Obligation and liquidation periods

Tribal Allocation Sizes

(Based on the FY 2016 CCDF Tribal Allocations)

Establishes 3 tiers of Tribal Lead Agencies based on the size of their allocation using the FY 2016 CCDF Allocation Table

Small Allocation Tribes

(Under \$250,000)

S

Must spend their funds in alignment with CCDF Goals and Purposes

Exempt from the majority of CCDF requirements (must meet quality and health and safety requirements)

Option to submit an abbreviated CCDF Plan

Medium Allocation Tribes

(\$250,000 - \$1 million)



Allowed the same exemptions as the Large allocation category

Exempt from operating a certificate program

Large Allocation Tribes

(Over \$1 million)



Subject to the majority of CCDF requirements

Some Tribal-specific exemptions

Final Approval Letters

- Each Tribal Lead Agency will be notified of their FY 2020-2022
 CCDF Plan approval status through a letter from the OCC
 Director
 - Approved
 - Approved with conditions, pending additional corrective action by the Tribal Lead Agency or by the state
 - Conditions will be deemed fully met once all provisions in the CCDBG Act of 2014 and final rule are fully implemented
- The letter will also list the provisions requiring corrective action
 - In some cases, Tribal Lead Agencies rely on partnerships with states for some requirements and states will need to take corrective actions for Tribal CCDF Plans to be in compliance



Ongoing Monitoring of CCDF Program

- The CCDF Plan includes questions that encompass all elements as required by regulations at 45 CFR 98.81
- However, the Plan does not ask about all aspects of Federal requirements
- Recognizing that the information in the Plans is not exhaustive, OCC will monitor Tribes' compliance through multiple mechanisms





Plan Amendments

- Any substantial changes to your CCDF program must be submitted as a plan amendment to your Regional Office for approval in accordance with 45 CFR 98.18(b)

Must make an attempt to determine the following for each staff member:



Criminal History




Sex Offender History



Child Abuse and Neglect History

Must conduct the following checks for each staff member:

In-State Sex Offender Check

In-State Child Abuse and Neglect Check

National Checks

FBI Fingerprint Check*

Information Center National Sex Offender Registry Check (NCIC NSOR)

Interstate Checks

Interstate Criminal History Check

Interstate Sex Offender Check

Approval/Conditional Approval

Tribal Programs that are not State-Licensed

Approved

 CCDBG background check provisions in CCDBG Act and Final Rule are fully implemented.

Approved with Conditions

- Approved with conditions, pending additional corrective action by the Tribal Lead Agency.
- TA will be made available to support implementation.

Note: For Tribes with a mix of non-State licensed programs and State licensed programs, Final Approval Letters will specifically indicate who must take corrective action (Tribe or State).

Tribal Programs that are State-Licensed

Approved

 CCDBG background check provisions in CCDBG Act and Final Rule are fully implemented.

Approved with Conditions

- Approved with conditions, pending additional correction action by the State.
- OCC will determine the State's status on any non-compliant provisions and will provide TA.
- The Tribe will not be required to propose any alternative approaches to satisfy/meet any of State's non-compliant provisions.



Timeline for Compliance

- October 1, 2019: CCDBG Act of 2014 and final rule requirements in effect
- January 2020: FY 2020-2022 Plans approved (with conditions)
- 2020-2021: Ongoing effort with OCC and TA partners for Tribes to come into full compliance with CCDF requirements
- July 2022: FY 2023-2025 CCDF Plan submission
- October 1, 2022: FY 2023-2025 CCDF Plan in effect
 - FULL compliance with CCDF requirements
 - Non-compliance may result in possible penalties
