Content Areas for Health and Safety Standards That Must Be in Place for Child Care and Development Fund (CCDF) Providers

Prevention and control of infectious diseases (including immunization)

Prevention of sudden infant death syndrome and use of safe sleep practices

Administration of medication

Prevention of and response to emergencies due to food and allergic reactions

Building and physical premises safety

Prevention of shaken baby syndrome and abusive head trauma

Emergency preparedness and response planning

Handling and disposal of hazardous materials and biocontaminants

Precautions in transporting children (if applicable)

Pediatric first aid and CPR

Recognition and reporting of child abuse and neglect

1. Providers/settings includes eligible (regulated or registered) providers that are not currently serving CCDF children.
2. Lead Agency may develop alternate monitoring requirements for care provided in the child's home that are appropriate to the setting.

Final Rule (45 C.F.R. § 98.44)

- Trainings must be completed within 3 months.
- The trainings are for caregivers, teachers, and directors.
- Lead Agency must specify critical health and safety training that must be completed before caregivers, teachers, and directors are allowed to care for children unsupervised.
- Child development is required in trainings.
- Trainings must be appropriate to the setting and age of children.


National Landscape

- Develop state-specific content or purchase from national vendors
- Offer free of charge or charge minimal fee
- Partner with higher education or child care resource and referral
- Deliver face-to-face or distance learning, or a hybrid approach


