Coordinated specialty care team for women with behavioral health and substance use issues to divert and reunify children from foster care.

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Team members experienced in providing trauma-informed treatment approaches for women, pregnant women and post-partum mothers.

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Providing care from pregnancy through three years after birth of child.

# IMPART

## Services

- Medication-Assisted Treatment (MAT)
- Group and/or individual counseling
- Accessing prenatal, dental and health care, resources, and child care
- Crisis intervention
- Mental health and substance abuse assessment and treatments
- Parenting classes and support
- Education on child development
- Employment and education services
- Ages and Stages Questionnaire-ASQ 3 and ASQ-SE (Social and Emotional)





# IMPACT OF IMPART

- Improving the health and support system of the mother or child
- Promoting attachment between mother and child
- Reducing children's stay in foster care and Children's Division involvement



# IMPACT OF IMPART

- Connecting mother and child with needed resources to ensure basic needs are addressed
- Reducing the need for crisis intervention and utilization of emergency room
- Ultimately developing a best practice model that can be replicated across health systems

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Having a safe, supportive, non-judgmental environment pre- and post-partum has been cited by many women as helpful to their general well-being and can significantly reduce out-of-home placements for a child.
