Leading Change in EC Systems

- State Advisory Council/Strategic Planning
 - Infant/Toddler goal (EHS/CC Partnership)
 - Implementation of QRIS
 - Pre-K Expansion grant
 - Great deal of existing alignment-with child focus, family friendly, provider fair but specific to a quality lens (longer authorizations for high quality programs)

- Partners/Key Stakeholders
 - Head Start Collaboration Office
 - Publicly funded early childhood programs

 - Health

- Strategic Plan
 - Look for initiatives/activities that support goals
 - EHS/CC Partnerships
 - CCDF Reauthorization
 - Licensing Regulation Revisions
 - Home Visiting Expansion
 - Kellogg Foundation Funding

Leading Change in EC Systems

- Lessons Learned
 - Provide data to the EHS grantee about child care partners in targeted areas and level of existing quality (allows for easier transition into quality/Head Start Performance Standards)
 - Focus on timelines (realistic?)
 - Aligning eligibility criteria earlier in process
 - Model flexibility
 - Assign staff
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
